Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya, a prominent institution of higher education, was established in 1991 through the initiative of the people from the greater Narengi area. Located in the easternmost part of Guwahati city, the college has made significant progress in providing and promoting higher education among various ethnic and linguistic groups. The foundation of the college was laid on 2nd September 1991, with evening classes held at Narangi High School. Within a few months, the college moved to its permanent site. The land for the construction was donated by Late Nanda Rangpi, Late Ramdhan Bongrang, Late Nabin Bongrang, Late Pabin Kra, Late Bhadaram Bey, Mr. Lakhindra Kra, and Mr. Beban Rongchell.

Today, the college takes pride in its journey of growth. The Commerce stream (self-financed), which was introduced on 6th August 2012, has now become a well-established department with a growing number of students and staff.

The college currently offers a range of facilities, including ample classrooms, a digital library with a reading room, laboratories for both the Education and Geography departments, separate common rooms for boys and girls, departmental rooms, an IQAC room, a students' union office, and an indoor stadium. In addition, the Principal's office and staff office rooms complete the infrastructure of the college.

With the combined efforts of the Governing Body, highly qualified teachers, and dedicated individuals from the greater Narengi area, as well as support from the Government of Assam, the college has evolved into a fully functional institution that provides an excellent academic environment. The college has earned a strong reputation through its students, who have excelled in academics, sports, music, and culture, with some achieving recognition at both the national and international levels. Additionally, the college actively engages with rural communities through various programs under NSS and NCC.

### GENERAL RULES:

1. A student shall lose their right of admission to the class if they fail to attend classes continuously for 15 teaching days from the date of commencement of classes.
2. The courses of study at Narangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya are full-time courses. Therefore, no student is allowed to pursue any other full-time course simultaneously. Violation of this provision will lead to disciplinary action.
3. Students are responsible for their own conduct and shall be liable to disciplinary action for any violation of the institution's rules of discipline. Disciplinary actions may include a warning and/or fine, and/or suspension from classes, examinations, the use of the college library, or even expulsion from the college.
4. Students shall conduct themselves in a decorous manner towards both members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and their fellow students. Insubordination, unbecoming language, or indecorous conduct, including teasing, ragging, or assaulting others, will be severely dealt with.

5. Students shall maintain perfect silence in the classroom and reading room and refrain from demonstrating disorderly behavior. They must not loiter in the corridors or in front of the classrooms and must remain as quiet as possible at all times.
6. Students shall take proper care of the college property, furniture, and premises. They must not spoil, damage, or tamper with the college property, furniture, or fittings.
7. Students shall park their bicycles, scooters, or motorcycles only in the designated shed. No two-wheelers should be parked in any other part of the college campus or in front of the college gate.
8. No society may be formed in the college without the permission of the Principal, nor shall any individual be invited to address a meeting in the college without prior permission from the college authorities.
9. No notice may be circulated or pasted inside the college without the prior permission of the Principal.
10. Students are prohibited from bringing any items deemed by the college authorities to have a dangerous or disruptive influence on the academic environment. The use of cell phones is strictly prohibited during classes. Students who fail to switch off their cell phones inside the classroom will be fined Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred only). Students found in possession of cell phones inside the examination hall will be liable to expulsion.
11. **College Uniform:** All students are required to attend college in the uniform as specified below:

- **Girls:** Dark pink salwar and dupatta with light pink kurta.  
**Winter wear:** Light pink sweater or blazer.
- **Boys:** White shirt with grey collar and cuffs, and grey pants.  
**Winter wear:** Grey sweater or blazer.

- **Leggings, churidars for girls, and jeans for boys are strictly prohibited on the college premises.**
- **The uniform should only be stitched by the recommended tailor.**

## **College Library:**

Through this initiative, Arangi Anchalik Mahavidyalaya seeks to instill in students the importance of good character, which is the foundation for becoming a trustworthy, compassionate, and resilient individual. By engaging in various scouting activities, students will be encouraged to develop leadership abilities that will prepare them for future roles in society, helping them build the confidence and skills to lead with integrity and empathy.

In addition to leadership and character building, the program places a significant emphasis on citizenship training. Students will be guided on how to actively contribute to society, fostering a spirit of volunteerism, teamwork, and community service. ### **LITERARY CLUB:**

A Literary Club of NAM was formed on 19<sup>th</sup> June, 2023. Soon after the club formation,

**WORLD POETRY DAY** and **WORLD PUPPETRY DAY** was celebrated on 21<sup>st</sup> March with recitation of students and teachers of the institution. This year MOU was signed with All Assam

Poets Association with an aim to conduct more programmes in different genres of literature in near future too.

### **NAM Yuva Tourism Club:**

This club promotes responsible and sustainable tourism in the neighboring areas. So far the Club has worked on making students aware by organizing Tourism Quiz and awareness about local tourist spots and a survey on Karbi culture in and around Oughuli area.

### **Green Club, NAM:**

### **STUDENT COUNSELLING & PLACEMENT CELL:**

The main aim of this cell is to provide mentoring, counseling, and support to the students in their educational, professional as well as personality development. It also provides guidance, training, and placement services to the students. There is a Multipurpose Cooperative society in our college,
